Biggest festival for farmers of Nepal



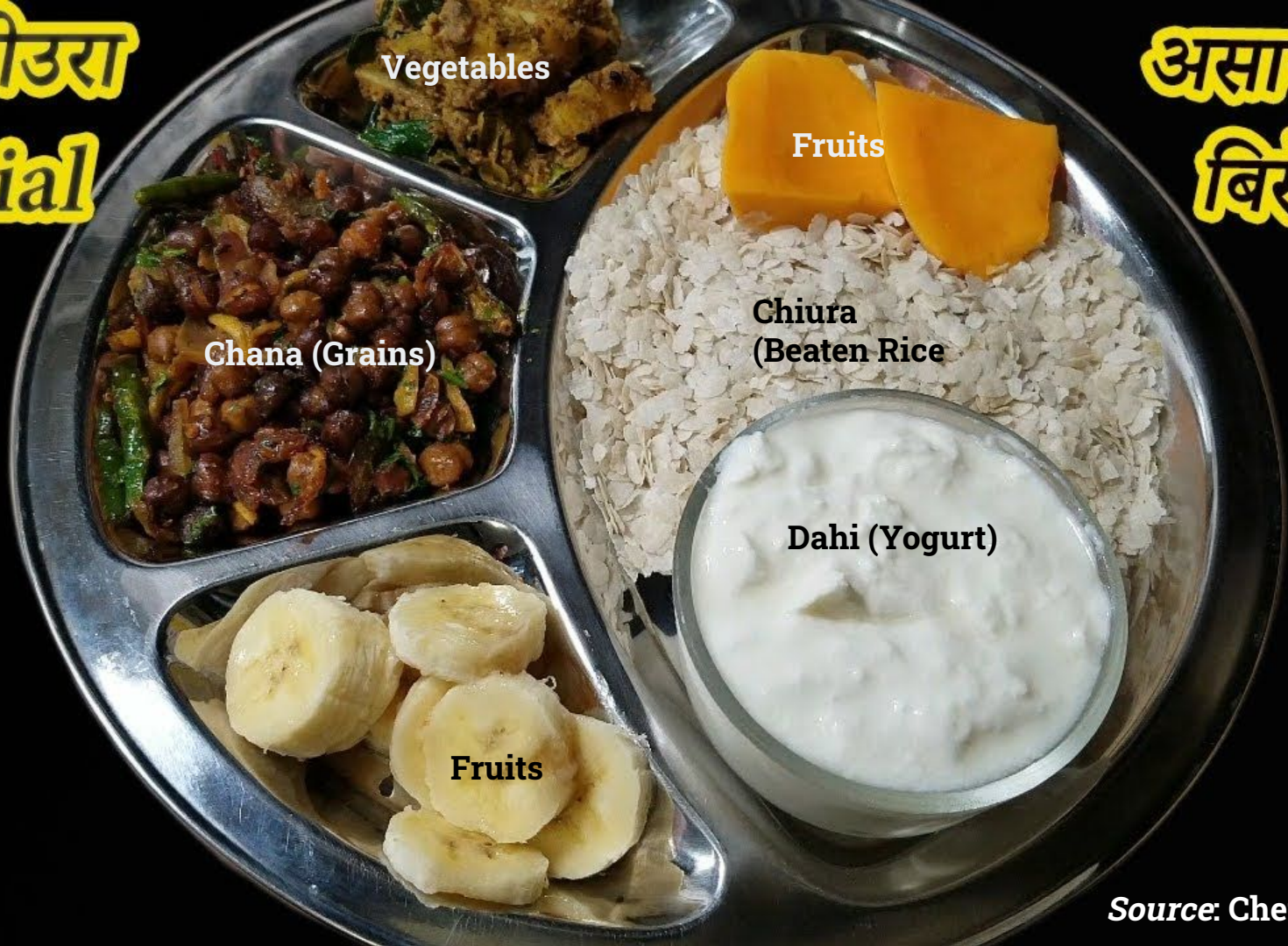
- Farmers plough the field

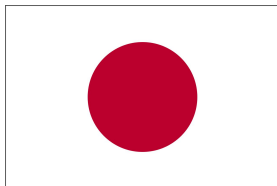

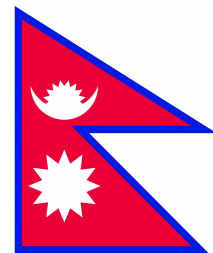
